A FOND FAREWELL TO OUR "SECOND-TO-LAST" POST 555 WWII VETERAN



Robert Ellsworth Genry, Uncle of Chic and Rita Cecchini

Robert Ellsworth Genry, age 97, passed away on February 7, 2024. He was born in Lacey, Alabama on March 3,1926 and attended the Maylene School.

A career military man, he served in the United States Navy from May 1944 through May 1946. In April 1949, he joined the United States Army where he served until his retirement in September 1969. He served in World War II, Korea, and Vietnam, and rose to the rank of Chief Warrant Officer 2 (CW2).

He was preceded in death by his wife of 69 years, Margaret Harand Genry; parents, John Henry and Alice Annie Brantley Genry; sister, Vera Genry England (Rudolph); and three brothers, Heyward Genry (Frances), Perry Genry (Betty), and Travis Genry. He is also survived by his brother Don Genry (Shirley) and many nephews, nieces, and extended family.

Robert Ellsworth Genry, the uncle of Chic and Rita Cecchini, was laid to rest at the Alabama National Cemetery in Montevallo, Alabama on March 4, 2024 at 11:00 a.m. We gathered at Committal Shelter #1 to honor Mr. Genry. He was surrounded by many family members, including Chic and Rita Cecchini, and Chic's fellow Veterans of The American Legion Matthew Blount Post 555. The American Legion Patriot Guard Riders were present as was Roy Brook with his new American flag. Uncle "Ell" (as he was lovingly called) received military honors as were fitting for someone who served faithfully for so many years. He had his American flag folded and presented to his brother Don Genry, he had a 21-gun salute, several people spoke on his behalf, and the ceremony ended with Taps being played by Mr. James Quakenbush, a member of Bugles Across America.

All in all, it was a fitting tribute to Uncle "Ell" and his friends and family members. He will be remembered for years to come as he is interred in Section Six, Site 717 as one of our Fallen Heroes. Those of you who know Chic and Rita Cecchini might want to stop by and pay your respects to CW2 Robert Ellsworth Genry the next time you visit the Alabama National Cemetery to perhaps place flags for Memorial Day or Veterans Day, or to place wreaths prior to the annual Wreaths Across America Campaign.

Sons of The American Legion Squadron 555

Legion Family Hosts Event to Connect Veterans and Community with Valuable Resources Sons of the American Legion (SAL) Squadron 555 and the "Triple Nickel" Legion Family came together on March 9, 2024 to host a Veterans Resource Fair Open House, offering a wide array of support services and resources for Veterans, their families, and the Pelham community.

Originally conceived by Squadron 555 members as a way to connect Veterans with important resources (while also completing a challenge issued by SAL National Commander Hall), the event grew to showcase the commitment of The American Legion Family to serve and support our nation's Veterans and youth.

The Veterans Resource Fair featured nearly two dozen exhibitors, including representatives from numerous VA programs and all branches of the Legion Family: The American Legion, Sons of the American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary, and American Legion Riders.

Members of the Support Committee for the Alabama National Cemetery (SCALNC) and the Blue Star Salute Foundation (BSSF) shared information about how their initiatives honor those who have served. Birmingham's Lakeshore Foundation connected with Veterans who may be eligible for free membership to their facilities, while Service Dogs of Alabama shared information about their program as well. A representative of Sorenson's Caption Call demonstrated their no-cost telephone captioning service for those with hearing loss.

Although serving Veterans is a major part of The American Legion Family, that is not their exclusive focus. Members of the Post 555 Boys State and Oratorical Contest programs were available to share information about youth leadership development and scholarship opportunities available through their programs.

Scout Troop 404 had troop leaders and scouts on hand throughout the day to talk about the work they do, including a recent joint project between the scout troop and the SAL Squadron to provide a flag deposit box into which community members can place worn American Flags to be retired. Just outside the building, an American Flag flies proudly on a flag pole dedicated to Matthew Blount Post 555, erected as Troop 404 Eagle Scout Connor McDonald's Eagle Project. Also just outside the doors of the Open House were several outdoor displays, including the Birmingham VA Health System's brand new HPACT Mobile Medical Unit (MMU) (which offers services to Veterans who cannot make it to a traditional facility) and the LifeSouth Bloodmobile.

The blood drive, which collected eight life-saving donations during a time of emergency blood need, also marked Squadron 555's successful completion of the Four Pillar Squadron Challenge issued to all squadrons by SAL National Commander JR Hall. Having already completed three pillars of the national "Four Pillars" challenge – *Children & Youth through Child Welfare Foundation (CWF) support, VA&R through Operation Comfort Warriors (OCW) support, and Americanism through Alabama Boys State support – hosting the blood drive supported the final National Security pillar.*

Blood donations were not the only way that the event helped the community, either. A donation barrel to support Grace Klein Community's "March for Hunger" initiative collected a large amount of non-perishable foods to help those in need.

Back inside, a series of videos played throughout the day in the Legion Theater, giving visitors more information about the purpose, mission, history, and accomplishments of the Legion Family. With the Legion, Sons, Auxiliary, and Riders all represented at the event, it was truly a "Legion Family" event. The Department of Alabama's NEC Rico Hall and Alternate NEC Ron Bradstreet also stopped in to check out the event, during which the Triple Nickel family expanded through new membership.

"The event came together nicely," said Squadron 555 Commander Donald Walker. "Credit for the idea of expanding our blood drive event into a larger resource fair goes to Bill and Ron," referring to Squadron Vice Commander Bill Blank and Adjutant Ron Koonce, who also serves as the SAL Detachment of Alabama's Americanism Chairman. "We had an awesome team of Squadron and Post members who came together to organize, promote, and staff the event; we had great exhibitors, and I was happy to see visitors get the help they needed and get connected with these resources."
