Who Are the Patriot Guard Riders?

The Patriot Guard Riders (PGR) was formed in 2005 to shelter and protect the deceased's family against protesters from the Westboro Baptist Church, who claim the deaths of American troops in Iraq and Afghanistan are divine retribution. PGR members positioned themselves to physically shield the mourners from the presence of the Westboro protesters by blocking the protesters from view with their motorcade, or by having members hold American flags. The group also drowns out the protesters' chants by singing patriotic songs or by revving motorcycle engines.

Although initially founded by motorcyclists, the organization is open to anyone, regardless of political affiliation, veteran status, or whether they ride or not. The only prerequisite is "a deep respect for those who serve our country; military and first responders". The Patriot Guard was established in Mulvane, Kansas, at American Legion Post 136 in 2005. The

founding members incorporated the organization as a 501(c)(3) non-profit in the State of Oklahoma.

The group's mission quickly expanded to include the funerals of law enforcement

officers, fire department personnel, all first responders, and any active-duty member or veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces from all previous wars and conflicts and is now largely focused on recognizing and honoring the sacrifices of dead service members as well as their families and loved ones. As of 2011, PGR reported over 329,000 members and operates throughout the United States. It is anticipated that at the end of 2020 the PGR had nearly 500,000 members nationwide. In addition to their attendance at funerals, the group also greet troops returning from overseas at welcome home celebrations, deployment ceremonies, and performs volunteer work for veteran's organizations such as Veterans Homes. Many American Legion Members also ride with the Patriot Guard.

YOUR ANNUAL DUES ARE DUE FOR 2022 AS OF JULY 1, 2021!!!

As promised in my September newsletter article, I am keeping you up-to-date on our membership numbers for 2022 every month. As of today's report, we have 119 members paid through 2022, but this does include the PUFL (Paid Up For Life) members, so I need to continue to see renewals come through for all of you who are annual members. I do want to point out that we are doing very well regarding our standing with the State Department. A report came out on 9/15/21 showing that we had 109 members which put us at exactly 50% of our goal of 218 for the year, but I did notice that the PUFL members were not included for some reason; not sure why. So, the next report that came out on 9/21/21 put us at 55.5% of our goal with 121 members (11 PUFL and 110 annual) and it did include the PUFL members. Today's report shows a total of 119 (11 PUFL) an 108 annual), so I need to see where two of our members went.....

Everyone should have received their notification from The American Legion asking for your dues for 2022, so please make sure you take care of that as soon as you can. One reason for doing it now will prevent you from continuing to receive more notifications and mistakenly paying duplicate times. I have heard some members tell me that they are going to wait until the end of 2021 to pay their 2022 dues, but I try to explain to them that the State Department puts reports out that have certain percentages that need to be met at certain times of the year, so the earlier we get our 2022 dues in, the better we will do in meeting these requirements. Make your check payable to **Matthew Blount Post 555** and put it along with the "Dues Notice" in an envelope and mail to the Post address which is 50 Racquet Club Parkway, Pelham, AL 35124. Ron Koonce will get them out of the mailbox at the Pelham Senior Center, deposit your check, and send me a copy of the "Dues Notice" for me to update your membership in MyLegion.org as a 2022 paid member! I will then send your 2022 membership card via USPS along with a nice letter thanking you for your Service and continued support of Post 555. I cannot wait to send

you my nice "thank you" letter and your 2022 membership card with my signature on it; that is the best part of my job as Adjutant; taking care of YOU!!!

Do not get behind on your membership since that would affect the loss of your benefits. If you pay your 2022 dues after 12/31/21, your membership will have expired, so don't take a chance that you might forget and lose your valuable benefits. Everyone is important to the Post even if you cannot participate in meetings or events. We still want you to stay on our rolls as an honored member of Post 555.

If you are a current R.S.V.P. (Retired Senior Volunteer Program) member, don't forget to report your volunteer hours for the month of September when you come to the October 14, 2021 Post 555 General Membership Meeting. No, I did not type the wrong date for the date of the next meeting. We will be meeting in the HOG Meeting Room at the Heart of Dixie Harley Davidson dealership. The Pelham Senior Center is getting busier each day, and they are mandating the wearing of masks, so Commander Monday would like us to meet the second week of October at the alternate location. Benefits AttenTION!

Surviving Spouses Stay alert! Stay alive!

Getting VA Benefits as a Surviving Spouse Many spouses rely on monthly veterans' disability benefits to help support their families. These benefits become even more crucial if your spouse dies as a result of their service-connected disabilities.

Spouses of disabled veterans may be eligible for VA benefits, such as disability compensation, health care, education and training, employee services, insurance coverage, and survivors' benefits. Surviving spouses of veterans may also be eligible for Dependency and Indemnity Compensation.

(DIC) is a monthly benefit that VA awards to a surviving spouse or dependent child(ren) of a service member who:

- Died in action
- Died from a service-connected condition

DIC is separate from the benefits the veteran may have been receiving during their lifetime. As of December 2020, the fixed monthly benefit amount for DIC is \$1,357.56. However, the DIC rate changes annually based on the cost of living adjustments.
