

NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

ELIGIBILITY: Eligible participants in The American Legion National High School Oratorical Contest shall be citizens of or lawful permanent residents of the United States.

All contestants must be bona fide students herein described as any students under the age of twenty (20) years on the date of the National Contest who is presently enrolled in a high school or junior high school (public, parochial, military, private or state accredited home school) in which the curriculum of said school is of high school level commencing with grade nine (9) and terminating with grade twelve (12). Students must be enrolled in high school or junior high school during the time of participation at any level of The American Legion National High School Oratorical Contest.


The three finalists of the National Contest will be ineligible for further participation at any level.

To receive the first-place award at any level within the Department of Alabama, the winner must represent the American Legion at the next level of the contest.

Legion Family Mid-Winter

This year's Mid-Winter Conference was held at the Embassy Suites Hotel in Huntsville, Alabama January 15-18, 2026.

Sons of American Legion Alabama Detachment

The Detachment of Alabama Midwinter Conference was held on 17 January in Huntsville in conjunction with the Department conference, where Legion Family Members from across the state gathered to learn, reconnect, and conduct business. SAL Detachment of Alabama VC Walker, a Squadron 555 member was able to share a strong membership report for Area 3, including all three 23rd District Squadrons with Squadron 17 leading the way at 145%, Squadron 131 over 100%, and Squadron 555 already closing in on the February target.

Department Commander Willie Rogers addressed the SAL, praising their work toward strengthening the Legion's Four Pillars and speaking about the communication, involvement, and leadership necessary to drive progress in the organization.

During his address, Detachment Commander Paul Woodyard also stressed the importance of SAL involvement, urging Sons to show up and actively participate in district meetings; hopefully there will be a good turnout of SAL members at the upcoming D23 meeting in Talladega.

At the conference, information was shared regarding the Alabama Yellowhammer College (AYLC). Those in officer positions (or interested in becoming an officer) should prepare to attend AYLC by completing the free online Legion Basic Training course and possessing a uniform cover. Legionnaires will coordinate the application process through their District Commander; Sons will send applications to their Detachment Vice Commander.

A highlight of the SAL conference was a presentation by Squadron 114 Adjutant, Doc Scheffler, regarding efforts to get SAL VAVS Reps placed at Alabama's three VAMCs, what is needed, and how both Sons and the broader Legion Family can get involved to help support our Veterans in the VA medical system and fulfill their needs through manpower and materiel. We hope to have an update soon about SAL VAVS Rep certification by the individual hospitals.
