The Post meeting will move to Tuesday 3 August 2021 This will give us the opportunity to host the Meet and Greet the night before the Tournament starts.



# **Be Expanding in 2021 Thanks to a New Law** Within two years of the bill becoming law, the VA Jim Absher will begin paying the costs to transport a decease

Congress has passed legislation making several changes to benefits administered by

the <u>Department of Veterans Affairs</u> and sent it to President Donald Trump's desk to be signed into law.

The legislation, known as the Johnny Isakson and David P. Roe, M.D. Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvements Act of 2020, makes several changes to existing benefit programs.

Here are some of the additional changes that may affect you:

### **Expansion of Medal of Honor Pension**

The monthly pension paid to Medal of Honor awardees will be paid to their surviving spouse upon the death of the service member. Surviving spouses receiving Dependency Indemnity Compensation (DIC) are not eligible. The current Medal of Honor pension is \$1,388.68 a month; it changes annually based on inflation.

### **Home Loans for National Guard Members**

National Guard members without active-duty service will be eligible to receive a VA home loan beginning in 2021. The new law makes Guard and Reserve members who have at least 90 days of service eligible for the home loan program. Thirty of those days must have been consecutive. Currently, only Guard and Reserve members who had at least 90 days of active service are eligible for home loans.

### **Memorial Benefits**

Within two years of the bill becoming law, the VA will begin paying the costs to transport a deceased veteran's remains to state and tribal veterans cemeteries. Currently, the VA will pay only to transport a deceased veteran's remains to a national veterans cemetery.

In two years, the VA will begin furnishing urns for storing the cremated remains of deceased veterans. Families will have the option of receiving a free headstone or burial urn, but not both. Currently, most veterans are eligible to receive a free headstone upon their death, but not an urn.

Also, veterans who receive the free VA-issued headstone and are buried in either a state or private cemetery will be able to have their spouse's name engraved on the headstone at no cost. Currently, the family must pay to have the spouse's name engraved on a VA-issued headstone. This will be effective for deaths going back to Oct. 1, 2019.

### **Native Americans and VA Copay**

Within one year of the law becoming effective, all Native Americans will be exempt from any VA copay for health care or medication, regardless of whether the individual has a service-connected disability.

One of the most influential mentors in my life has stated 15 principles that he has learned after 59 years of pastoral ministry! I will be passing them on to you, a few at a time, and commenting on them as to why they are worth remembering.

### Life Principle

"Tell people <u>now</u> how you feel about them-not later" Sometimes you really wish you had done that before they died."

How often have you heard the words, "I didn't get to tell them that I loved them," or something similar to those words?

COVID kept me home last Spring from going overseas to do my missionary work. I decided to go to Englewood, FL to see my mom who had been bedridden for a long time from a deteriorating spine for a long time. When I left, I climbed up on my knees on her bed, wrapped her up into my arms, prayed with her, told her that I loved her, and said goodbye.

Three days later I got a call that she had sudden taken a serious turn for the worse, so much so and that she would be going into Hospice care in two days! I rushed back down to Florida, planning to talk to her the next morning through the window

of the hospital and tell her how much I loved her. Right after I arrived in Florida, I got a call and was told that she had died. She was 88. I didn't get to tell her goodbye, which made my visit with Mom three days earlier a most precious time. She knew that I loved her.

We have probably all failed to tell people in the past what they really mean to us. Let me challenge us all to decide that we swallow our pride or forget about being embarrassed, or whatever it is that is holding us back, and tell those we care about how we really feel about them.

It is with deep sorrow that we must announce that Ron passed away from Chronic Kidney Disease while in home hospice care in his Tuscany condominium. He was 89 years old. Preceding Ron in death were his parents, Bill and Anna Seibert of Fort Thomas, Ky and his brothers, Bob Ruberg of Ft Wright, Tom Ruberg of Severna Park MD, Bill Seibert of Salem OR, and Sister Mary Kevan, SND of Covington. Surviving him are his brother Don, and his wife, Martha, as well as 22

nieces and nephews, who are located as near as Ft Wright and as far away as Anchorage, Alaska. All of them feel a special kind of love for "Uncle Ron"! Ron attended St Xavier High School and Newport Catholic High School, the University of Kentucky and the University of Miami. From 1951 to 1955, Ron served in the U.S. Navy at the Naval Academy in Annapolis and for 2 years (and 2 circumnavigations of the World) aboard the aircraft carrier, USS Wasp. He achieved the rank of Storekeeper First Class. Ron was a member of American Legion Matthew Blount Post 555, Pelham, AL.

Later, Ron joined Avis Car Rental and quickly became a city manager, a capacity in which he functioned in many cities, including Minneapolis, Detroit, Los Angeles, Honolulu, Maui, San Francisco, Miami and New York City. Promoted to Zone manager, Ron was responsible for the Avis State of Florida operation, the largest of its kind in their network. Later, he was promoted to Vice President in the corporate offices in New York. He worked at Avis for 27 years, finally retiring in Virginia Beach, VA in 1984. Moving to various condos In Ft Lauderdale, Daytona Beach, and Naples, FL, he found great companionship with Nancie Kres Beg, whom he loved and supported until her death in 2017. Ron then moved to Birmingham, AL to be close to family and in August of 2020, to Covington, KY to be closer to Sister Mary Kevan, SND, who passed away about the same time.

Ron was a fun loving and very caring person to all with whom he made contact. A Celebration of Life Mass was held at St Agnes Church, Ft Wright, KY on Thursday, July 15, 2021. His cremains will be interred, with full military honors at the National Veteran's Cemetery in Williamstown, KY.
