## Lakotich Is Legionnaire of the Year

Trustee Frank Lakotich, a nine-year veteran of the American Legion, is Post 555's Legionnaire of the Year for 2017.

Post Commander Tom McDaniel said Lakotich was selected for his outstanding contribution to Post 555 and the Pelham community during 2017. This honor is

awarded only once a year and is one of the most coveted awards in the American Legion.

Lakotich served in the U.S. Air Force from 1961 to 1969, during which he was in radio and television broadcasting. Frank broadcasted

all over Korea and Turkey giving support and news to our troops. At one time the North Koreans put a bounty on Frank's head to suppress his broadcasting efforts and pro American commercials.

After a break in service, Frank enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserve and was an Army broadcaster from 1982 to 1996.

On leaving the service af-

ter a total of 21 years of service, he was employed by U.S. Steel for 20 years, Florida Steel for two years and O'Neal Steel for 20 years in which he served as corporate safety manager.

Locally, Frank is a mem-

# Officers, firefighter honored

Post 555 recognized police officers and a firefighter at its April meeting.

Pelham Police Officer James Campbell and Shelby County Sheriff's Office Deputy Rachel Ivey were honored as Officers of the Year. Pelham Fire Department Capt. Everett Hazen was named Firefighter of the Year.

Police Chief Larry Palmer, Sheriff John Samaniego and Fire Chief Tim Honeycutt presented the awards, along with Post Commander Tom McDaniel.

Palmer said Campbell has "a true concern for the citizens he serves." He praises the officer's concern for veterans and his drug prevention efforts.

Samaniego called Ivey "the quintessence of a public servant." He cited her dedication as a traffic homicide investigator and school resource officer.

Honeycutt said Hazen "exhibits everything good in a team member that a fire chief could want." In 2016, he completed the Alabama Smoke Diver School, and is also certified in water rescue. He has been a firefighter for 16 years.

In the fall of 1993 in Garden City, Mich., Chuck (Tramp) Dare and the commander of Michigan's American Legion Post 396, (Polka) Bill Kaledas shared an idea to start an association of motorcycle enthusiasts within The American Legion. The two Legionnaires — both long-time riders — wanted to provide an environment where post, Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion members who shared a common love for motorcycles could come together

Dare and Kaledas prepared a letter to Michigan Department Adjutant Hubert Hess. In his Nov. 19, 1993, reply, Hess agreed with the concept and stated that it "sounds like a great idea—let's work it out." In further correspondence and follow-up phone conversations, Hess gave the two riders instructions on how to manage such a program at the post level. He also provided information on how to get approval for the use of the American Legion Emblem and to get this program recognized and supported by the membership. The members of Post 396, at a regular Legion meeting, adopted a resolution for a new post program to be known as the "American Legion Riders".

Dare and Kaledas, joined by 19 other founding members of the Garden City Post 396, soon found themselves inundated with requests for information about the new organization, and agreed to establish a central source of information about the Riders, to make certain that the new "chapters" around the country formed not as motorcycle clubs or gangs, but as Legionnaires, Auxiliary, and SAL members joining to ride as members of The American Legion family. Pat Babcock, an SAL member from Michigan, soon established a website with sample by-laws and instructions for forming new Chapters. That website, [americanlegionriders.net](http://americanlegionriders.net), continues to be the primary source of information and assistance for new Chapters worldwide.

Each month I plan to pass on the History of the Rider and their part in The American Legion. The month of April has been a busy month, glad to see everyone and hope to see you at future Riders events. The month started out with the Making Strides 4 Multiple Sclerosis Ride, it was a great day of riding, great group of people hoisting. We had 8 Riders from Post 555 make the ride. The Legion, Sons and Auxiliary resented this fine and blessed day.

The Second Thursday of the month we found time to have the Riders monthly meeting. We meet monthly at the Heart of Dixie Harley Davidson Hog Room, 6:30pm meeting time. ## Vietnam veterans honored at Alabama Nat'l Cemetery

On March 29th, the Alabama National Cemetery in Montevallo was the site of a National Honor Vietnam Veterans Day ceremony. This brief ceremony was held in conjunction with other ceremonies nationwide commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War.

The program included the playing of Taps, presentation of a memorial wreath, folding of a United States flag which had flown over the U.S. Capitol and a keynote address by Vietnam Veteran John Atwell. John is a veteran of the Air Force and proud member of American Legion, Matthew Blount Post 555 in Pelham.

John included the following remarks in his address to the gathered fellow Vietnam Veterans and their families. “..I find resolve in the fact(s) that I helped a lot of people... I know I helped save a lot of lives... that I did my job to the best of my ability and I kept the vow to honor my country... I am proud to be an American – to be an Air Force Veteran, and to be here with you today.

“In closing, Vietnam was not an easy war – no, it wasn’t the war to end all wars or the great war – it was a dirty, ugly, political war – I didn’t talk about the war when I got home in ’67 – I certainly didn’t go around telling people I



loaded Napalm bombs for a living – it just wasn’t talked about – you pushed it deep down inside – it wasn’t until 2006 some 39 years after I got home – I had just bought my first Harley – I went into the dealer to buy some parts – when the parts manager came out I noticed his arms were covered with tattoos – Army Tattoos – and one said I love the smell of Napalm in the morning – I was in shock – I didn’t know what to say – and I mumbled something about loading Napalm in Vietnam and then he smiled and he reached across the counter and he put his hand out and said welcome home brother – that was the first time an-

yone had welcomed me home – I’ll never forget that.

And that’s why we’re here – to take care of each other – to comfort each other – to hear our stories and feel our pain and to know what we did wasn’t in vain – God Bless you all.”

John’s address was profound and heartfelt. It was obvious to all that it was difficult for him to share some of his comments publicly. There were many misty eyes from veterans and family members following the address. John truly did himself proud, did the Air Force proud, did all Vietnam veterans proud and did Post 555 proud with his remarks.

Welcome home John, and welcome home all Vietnam Veterans! Job well done!
