





A FOND FAREWELL TO STEPHEN McFADDEN COMBS 1944 - 2023



Steve's wife, Sally, wanted to start this remembrance of her husband, who was very patriotic, and she wanted to relate a hospital episode with everyone.

"When asked if he would like a Chaplain, he was enthusiastic about it. When the Chaplain arrived, he announced that he was of the Jewish faith. Steve immediately went into "political mode" and announced his support of Israel. The Chaplain expressed his gratitude and gave a generic prayer then sang a song in Hebrew and English which was pretty amazing." Sally stated that this was typical of Steve.

A speaker we once heard asked, "How did you live your "dash"? The – is the mark between one's year of birth and year of death. Steve Combs lived his dash with vigor and variety. As a pre-adolescent, he had an ice cream cycle, started a neighborhood newspaper, showed movies in the family garage, and assisted his best friend, Jim Underwood with a neighborhood radio station (unfortunately the FCC shut it down!). He

experienced grade school and middle school in Terre Haute. Indiana; attended and graduated from Culver Military Academy; then attended Rollins College where he was editor of the college newspaper. Upon graduation, Steve entered the Indiana National Guard. He married his college sweetheart in 1967 and moved back to Indiana where he continued his journalism career as the sports editor of The Plainfield Messenger. He later landed the job as editor of the Greenfield Daily Reporter. He acquired a master's degree in journalism at Ball State University. While in Greenfield, Steve became a certified EMT and worked for the Wishard Hospital Ambulance Service in Indianapolis. Later. he and his wife had their own ambulance service to relieve the local fire department from purely transport runs. He and the family moved to Florida in the early '80s and Steve became a tax accountant. He researched and co-authored a book Road Dog about a serial killer. He then found a profession that was a perfect fit: he taught Freshman Composition at the local junior colleges. He was a member of Oasis Lutheran Church in Lake Mary, Florida and maintained that membership after he moved to Alabama to be closer to family. He was an active member of The American Legion Matthew Blount Post 555 in Pelham. Alabama. He was the proud father of two sons. Charles and Christopher; two daughters-in law, Melanie and Judy; and three grandchildren Kay, Jack, and Jordan. Steve Combs ended his days in peace.



This year, there were three different loads of wreaths from Maine to place on the headstones of our Fallen Heroes during the Wreaths Across America Ceremony Scheduled for Sat., December 16, 2023. The trucks arrived Sat., December 9, 2023 at 11:00 a.m., Mon., December 11, 2023 at 1:00 p.m., and the last one Thurs., December 14, 2023 at 11:00 a.m. There was a total of 819 boxes that were in a very different configuration than in the past. Each box held 12 wreaths and weighed about 40 pounds each. I was only able to help with the final load and was apprehensive of the size and weight of the boxes, but when we got lined-up inside the semi and started handing the boxes from one person to the next, it was not as hard as I thought it would be. Doing things like this is really a lot of fun due to everyone doing the same thing over and over and over with pretty much no complaining. As always, Post 555 was well-represented.

PELHAM "CHRISTMAS AROUND THE WORLD" PARADE




Leading the way for the Post 555 float is Riders Director, Doug McDaniel. Not sure who that "dude" is riding with him, but I like all of the decorations!!!






