We will have two or three guest speakers to change-up the meeting a little before the Christmas holidays. The first guest speaker is representing "CaptionCall". She presented this product to us at the 23rd District Quarterly Meeting at Post 131 in Columbiana on November 5, 2022 and Commander Monday and I agreed that it would be beneficial for everyone to hear. In a nutshell, this is a federally-funded company that provides captioning telephones at NO COST to people with a hearing loss or who struggle to hear over the phone. She will have a phone with her to demonstrate and will give you an opportunity to set-up a visit for the installer to come to your home. The second guest speaker is going to talk to us about the "Hands-Free Bill" regarding distracted driving. She has first-hand experience with the loss of a loved one from texting and driving, so I think she will be sharing some good information that all of us need to hear. We may have one more guest speaker, but not confirmed as of yet. Please put this date on your calendar and join us for our fellowship meal at 6:00 p.m. and the guest speakers after our "protocol" that we do at every Post 555 meeting. Hope to see you!!!

Effective July 1, 2022, our new membership drive began. The Department of Alabama gave all Adjutants a list of goals to strive to reach or exceed between July 31, 2022 and May 31, 2023. Here is what they are asking us to do as far as membership numbers. You will notice that unfortunately I had to use the red highlighting because we fell short of the October goal of 65%, but do NOT give up; RENEW!!!

Cut-off Dates:

July 31st = 40% membership (need 90 members renewed/joined) – WE MET AND EXCEEDED THIS GOAL BY ACHIEVING 42.22% WITH 95 MEMBERS RENEW-ING FOR 2023—THANKS!!!

August 31st = 50% membership (need 113 members renewed/joined) – WE EXCEEDED THIS GOAL BY ACHIEVING 52.44% WITH 118 MEMBERS RENEWING FOR 2023—THANKS AGAIN!!!

September 30th = 55% membership (need 124 members renewed/joined) – <u>AS OF THE WRITING OF THIS ARTICLE, WE HAVE 55.56% WITH 125 MEMBERS RENEWING FOR 2023—WE DID IT AGAIN!!!</u>

October 31st = 65% membership (need 146 members renewed/joined) – AS OF THE DEADLINE, WE HAD 61.33% WITH 138 MEMBERS RENEWING FOR 2023. WE NEEDED EIGHT MORE, SO WE MISSED THIS ONE. LET'S SEE HOW WE DO WITH THE NOVEMBER 30TH GOAL OF 75%.

November 30th = 75% membership (need 168 members renewed/joined)

December 31st (Happy New Year) = 80% membership (need 180 members renewed/joined)

January 31st = 85% membership (need 191 members renewed/joined)

February 28^{th'} = 90% membership (need 202 members renewed/joined)

March 31st = 95% membership (need 213 members renewed/joined)

April 30th = 100% membership (225 members renewed/joined)

May 31st (Happy Memorial Day) = 103% membership (231 members renewed/joined)

As of today (November 13, 2022), we have 140 members (62.22%) which means we need 28 renewals and/or new members to meet the November 30th goal. If you want to be one of these **VERY IMPORTANT** 28 members, **PLEASE** renew either by mail or on-line at **mylegion.org**. I check the on-line renewals very frequently and would be **THRILLED** to see several names on there for November. So far, Jeffrey Ward renewed on-line on November 8th— YEAH—and the following members renewed by either mailing their renewals to the Post address or giving me their payments in person: Anita Bennett, Bobby Byram, David Coram Jr., Mark Sawyer, and Gerald Schrader— YEAH!!! I want to give credit to several members who renewed in October as well because every renewal COUNTS: Karryl Anderson, Jason Bailey, Andrew Burell, Edward Eagle, George Jones, Richard Mazzone, Aretha McGraw, James Mann IV, Alan Phillips, Karla Reagin-Young, and Daniel Topping—YEAH!!! Wouldn't you like to see your name in print for renewing in November, too?????
