I'm winding down a five week stint in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan, working with these young medical students who will all go back to India to be doctors. It is a real joy to graduate them and send them back to work in their own country of 1.2 BILLION people! Being the last week, I have been inundated with visits, etc., to our apartment, and so I found it best to email everyone.

I trust that you are all doing OK during this time of so much turmoil in our country. I know that all 217 Veterans on the Buddy Call list have any number of things going on in their lives. I certainly have my share of "heavies," and I know that you all do as well, as many of you share things with me that you have going on in your lives.

I watch these Indian young people really stick together because the Kyrgyz people do not understand them, and the Pakistani students do not care to be around them AT ALL, because politically they are enemies. The cohesiveness I see in these kids away from home reminds me of our Post and the camaraderie that is there for those of us who want it and accept it, and become a more intimate part of what we do for the community and abroad AND for each other.

As the Post Chaplain, the Triple Nickel is always on my prayer list, but this month I have been moved to pray for us all even more, as I have worked with these students "up close and personal." Please know that the Post is here for you, and if you have anything in your life that needs prayer, <u>please</u> pass that on to me.
