



FROM THE BENCH ...

I hope that all Comrades have been having an enjoyable Summer, and all vacations have gone as expected.

During a previous Executive Board meeting, Former Commander Barry Blount brought to our attention an issue where several of our members are in violation of one of the several rules and procedures not explicitly detailed in any guideline of American Legion etiquette.

It seems during the Department Convention in Montgomery, AL several Comrades from other posts approached Comrade Blount and advised him to remove a pin which was on his official American Le-

gion cap which indicated his former military rank.

As explained to Comrade Blount, while the wearing of such insignia is not explicitly prohibited, it is greatly frowned upon. While this display may be permitted within a particular Post, wearing rank insignia at a function with Legion members from other Posts could cause negative reactions.

It is reasonable to understand this when one reads the National Constitution of The American Legion; Article II Nature; Section 1. Rank does not exist in the Legion; no member shall be addressed by his military or naval title in any convention or meeting of the Legion.

So to avoid any future embarrassment or issues from other Legionnaires, it is recommended that all rank insignia be removed from the official American Legion cap.

Reviewing other official etiquette rules for the official American Legion cap, remember:

- 1) It is not proper to wear a Legion cap while eating a meal at an official American Legion or civic luncheon or dinner.
- 2) In meetings, the cap should be worn except during the Pledge of Allegiance, prayer and while standing in silent reverence in memory of departed comrades, when it should be held with the right hand over the heart.
- 3) By American Legion tradition, a female Legionnaire may leave her cap on during the Pledge of Allegiance, the national anthem, prayer and meals.
- 4) Legionnaires wishing to attach decorations and/or other official insignia to their caps are advised of a National Executive Committee resolution on the subject, excerpted below.

"Consecutive membership insignia, membership stars and/or decorations (authorized American Legion or military services) must be attached to the right side of cap. Fraternal or civil organization insignia cannot be used on American Legion caps."

5) Names or nicknames of individual members cannot be used on caps.

I hope this provides some enlightenment and guidelines for proudly wearing the official American Legion cap.

ever this job is, I will do it to the best of my ability, but I can't do it alone. I need everybody here on my team, helping us reach our goals and objectives. We are all stakeholders in this organization. We are the future of this organization."

A Paid-Up-For-Life member and past commander of American Legion Post 29 in Lenoir, N.C., Oxford said as The American Legion's centennial celebration comes to an end on Veterans Day, it's good time to look back on 100 years of successes and accomplishments.


He pointed out the Legion's role in creating the original GI Bill and being part of efforts to update it, the important role the organization played in the creation of what is now the Department of Veterans Affairs, the drafting of the U.S. Flag Code and, most recently, gaining passage of the LEGION Act.

Oxford noted the Legion's relationship with the American Legion Auxiliary and the growth of both the Sons of The American Legion and the American Legion Riders. And he pointed to youth programs such as American Legion Baseball, Boys State and Boys Nation. Junior Shooting Sports, the Oratorical Contest, youth law cadet programs and support for Scouting.

American Legion charitable funds, Oxford said, have provided millions in scholarship money, disaster relief and financial assistance. The Child Welfare Foundation has provided more than \$16 million in grants to organizations that contribute to the physical, spiritual, mental, and emotional needs of children. And the Legion's Operation Comfort Warriors provides items to recovering wounded warriors and veterans not covered by the federal government.

"When we think about those charities, there's one special thing about the Legion charities: 100 percent of the funds go toward the programs," Oxford said. "All operational and administrative costs are covered by The American Legion. All of that money goes to those charities. "All of these things we've talked about shows who we are, but it also shows what we do."

What the Legion also does, Oxford said, is promote Americanism through flag education and being involved in local schools, advocate for veterans' benefits and health care, support a strong national defense, and support America's youth.






