American Legion National Commander James W. "Bill" Oxford will award his 100 percent American Legion Family Ribbon to any American Legion Family that achieves 100 percent membership by June 30, 2021.

For this award, the Legion Family is defined as a post and any combination of an Auxiliary unit, Sons of The American Legion squadron or Legion Riders chapter.

Each branch must achieve 100 percent membership to qualify for the award.



The Post received this recognition a couple years back with 100% membership for all three Legion Family units: Post 555, Sons of The American Legion Squadron 555, and The American Legion Auxiliary Unit 555.

If you are a member of any of these units and have not renewed your membership for 2021, let's all work together toward getting another one of these awards for the Post Family.

ALABAMA NATIONAL CEMETERY, MONTEVALLO

Alabama Donation through American Legion Matthew Blount Post 555Pelham, Alabama

The Executive Committee of Post 555 made a commitment several years ago to consolidate donations and forward them to the Blue Star Salute Foundation Inc.(BSSFI).

The thought of making one large contribution, while still acknowledging individual contributors and memorial designations, would allow the American Legion commitment to make a single payment in support of Veterans and their families.

That is the basis for the Triple Nickel program. The deadline for individual contributions is October 29, 2020.

Dec. 19, 2020 is National Wreaths Across America Day. It is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization formed in 2007 as an extension of The Arlington Wreath Project, with over 1,500 participating locations in all 50 states, and 24 national veteran cemeteries on foreign soils. The Wreaths Across America program is a part of the Blue Star Salute Foundation Inc. The BSSFI is responsible for seeking and gathering donations from individuals and organizations to fund the annual purchase of wreaths to be placed at the National Cemeteries

The purchase price is \$15 for each wreath and the purchase is made by BSSFI for the annual ceremony at the Alabama National Cemetery in Montevallo.

The wreath-laying is still held annually, on the second or third Saturday of December. WAA's annual pilgrimage from Harrington, Maine to Arlington National Cemetery has become known as the world's largest veterans' parade, stopping at schools, monuments, veterans' homes and communities all along the way to remind people how important it is to:

Remember our fallen U.S. Veterans, Honor those who serve and Teach your children the value of freedom.

The US Military VET Motorcycle Club - Alabama Chapter Donated \$580. I can't say enough about our Riders and the support they provide to the Post. Thank you again, US Military Vet Motorcycle Club for your support and respect you show us. Recruit three new members for 'A Foundation for the Future' pin

American Legion National Commander James W. "Bill" Oxford will award his national commander "A Foundation for the Future" membership excellence pin to any Legionnaire who obtains three new members into The American Legion.

A new member is any eligible person joining for the 2021 membership year who was not a member of The American Legion during the 2020 membership year.

Each member listed must be eligible for membership in The American Legion. Forward names of Sons of The American Legion members or Auxiliary members to your detachment or unit for use in their respective incentive programs.

Only one pin will be awarded per individual.

Upon receipt, national membership staff will

confirm the names and mail the pin directly to the person who earned it.

Suicide Prevention

The highest priority with the Veterans Health Administration is Suicide Prevention. Many of you know the alarming statistics about Veteran Suicide. The month of September is Suicide Prevention Month. The VA provides a wonderful Suicide Prevention Program. We also know that most Veterans that commit suicide are not enrolled in the VA. I have included some resources you can share with Veterans you serve.

Suicide is preventable, and special training is not needed to prevent suicide. Everyone can play a role by learning to recognize warning signs, showing compassion to Veterans in need and offering support. Listed are actions anyone can take to Be There:

- Reach out to Veterans to show them you care. Send a check-in text, cook them dinner or simply ask, "How are you?"
- Learn the warning signs of suicide, found on the Veterans Crisis Line website.
- Watch the free S.A.V.E. training video to equip yourself to respond with care and compassion if someone you know indicates they are having thoughts of suicide.

- Check out VA's Social Media Safety Toolkit to learn how to recognize and respond to social media posts that may indicate emotional distress, feelings of crisis or thoughts of suicide.
- Contact VA's Coaching into Care program when worried about a Veteran or loved one. A licensed psychologist or social worker will provide guidance on motivating your loved one to seek support.



Guidelines for Wearing of The American Legion Cap

The left side (emblem side) of the cap is reserved only for the Legion emblem, city, county, district, or state lettering. If desired, the following items must be placed on the right side of the cap:

Additional lettering, restricted to either the name of a Post or to an officer title, such as Past Commander Cap insignias or badges for past or present officers

Consecutive membership insignia, membership stars, and/or authorized Legion or military service decorations Names or nicknames of individual members cannot be used on caps.

The Legion uniform cap should be worn by its members only when in attendance at official Legion m [Grab your reader's attention with a great quote from the document or use this space to emphasize a key point. To place this text box anywhere on the page, just drag it.]

Greetings or ceremonies or as official guests at patriotic or other civil functions or by individuals when officially representing The American Legion on public occasions.

A member is considered to be in uniform if wearing an official Legion uniform cap. Therefore, it is not proper to wear the cap while eating a meal at an official Legion or civic luncheon or dinner.

The cap should be worn in a place of worship only by the Guard of Honor, Color Guard, and Commander of same while in marching order or standing guard. When returned to and seated in pews, the cap should be removed.

Legion posts marching in formation into a place of worship should uncover at the door, hold the cap with the right hand over the heart until the arrival in the pews and commanded to take seats, remaining uncovered during the entire service. At the close of the service, upon command, the post shall arise, the members holding the cap with the right hand over the heart will march out of the place of worship and recover after marching through the door.

Legion members not in formation will uncover entering the place of worship and remain uncovered upon after leaving the place of worship.

When at a funeral, the cap should be held over the heart as one approaches the casket and is not at any time worn in a place of worship (except by the Guard of Honor, Color Guard, or Commander of same while in marching order or standing guard.) At the graveside, the cap should be held in the right hand over the heart during the entire service. In cold and inclement weather, the cap should not be worn.

In Legion meetings, the cap should be worn except during moments of the Pledge of Allegiance, prayer, and when standing in silent reverence in memory of departed comrades, when the cap should be held with the right hand over the heart.

Female members of the Legion should wear their caps in the manner prescribed for



WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA

The 2020 Wreaths Across America fundraising campaign is entering its final month!

This year's campaign has faced unforeseen challenges; just as we all have, due to the COVID-19 virus. This year it is expected that we will need between 7,500 and 8,000 wreaths at the National Cemetery in Montevallo. In years past, we have relied on donations made at our annual Thanksgiving family dinner for between 40% & 50% of our annual campaign total.

Unfortunately, we will not have the dinner this year due to COVID and limited Post financial resources. This has forced the campaign leadership team to seek other ways to make up the shortfall.

We have been blessed with an outstanding campaign leadership team this year including Nancy Waller, Eldon Woodie, and myself.

We have been fortunate to have partnered with the Exchange Club of Shelby County, the US Military Vets Motorcycle Club, and our own Triple Nickel Riders all of which have allowed us to reach our current level of donations.

Our campaign goal for this year is \$3,600.00. As of September 19th, our total donations received stands at \$2,759.00 or 76.6% of our goal.


