

When he completed infantry school in 1974, the Army sent Reistad to historic Fort Myer, Va., to serve with the Presidential Salute Battery of the 3rd U.S. Infantry Regiment – the Old Guard, the

Army's oldest active-duty infantry unit. He enjoyed the mission: firing cannon volleys for ceremonies and special events at Arlington National Cemetery and throughout the Washington, D.C., area. But it was only later, after he'd embarked on a career in law enforcement and become involved in The American Le-

gion, that Reistad began to fully appreciate those four years in the military.

"To be involved with a unit that prestigious is an honor," he says. "It's something I will forever cherish."

There's a pride in belonging to something bigger than yourself, something with a rich history. That's Reistad's message for Legionnaires as he leads the organization into its centennial year. Elected national commander at the 100th National Convention in Minneapolis on Aug. 30, he wants each and every member to consider themselves part of

his Team 100, building a strong membership and spreading the word about the Legion's unequaled record of veterans advocacy.

"This is a great year to celebrate The American Legion, and we're all stakeholders," Reistad says. "We all have a responsibility to ensure the Legion survives and thrives into the next century."

The military life chose Reistad as much as he chose it. His grandfather served in World War I. Three uncles served in World War II. His father met his mother at West Point, where he was a military policeman and she was a civilian employee.

As a boy, Reistad spent a lot of weekends at his grand-mother's home in Highland Falls, N.Y., a stone's throw from the front gate of the U.S. Military Academy, watching cadet sports, drills and parades. He even attended the New York Military Academy, President Trump's alma mater, for a short time.

"My parents were going through a divorce and felt it was the best environment for me," he says. "That one year influenced the rest of my life just in terms of learning discipline, taking responsibility for oneself, doing your best."



This month, I am repeating some of my comments from last month regarding the need for donations to purchase wreaths for the Wreaths Across America ceremony to be held at the Alabama National Cemetery in Montevallo in December. October is a critical month in fundraising as our consolidated contribution will be made following the November Post meeting.

As I announced at the last Post meeting, the annual Wreaths Across America drive for donations by the Blue Star Salute Foundation has begun. As burials continue to climb at the Alabama National Cemetery, it is expected that donations will need to be raised to pro-


vide a wreath for approximately 6,100 graves this year.

Wreath donations will again cost \$15 per wreath. The annual Wreaths Across America ceremony will take place on Saturday, Dec. 15 at 11 a.m. at the Alabama National Cemetery.

The Post is once again accepting donations for wreaths and will consolidate all donations received and forward them to the Blue Star Salute in November. We are prepared to accept these donations currently. Donation forms are available at each Post.

The 2018 campaign to date has raised a total of \$425 through Sept. 23rd. In 2017, the consolidated Post contribution was \$1,335. Though the need is nearly 24 percent higher than last year, our donations are lagging last year by 68 percent!

If you, a family member or friend wishes to donate for wreaths, please complete a donation form and give it to Chuck Kiser at a Post meeting, no later than Nov. 1st, along with a check for the total of wreaths donated and we will see that it is consoli-



dated with all Post donations and forwarded to the Blue Star Salute prior to the cut-off date of Nov. 5th.


