Spencer Bachus to speak at August meeting

Former Congressman Spencer Bachus will speak at the Aug. 2 meeting of American Legion Matthew Blount Post 555. The meeting begins at 7 p.m.,

Bachus served in Congress from 1993 until his retirement in 2015. He was ranking member and chairman of the House Financial Services Committee.

Born and raised in Birmingham, Bachus graduated from Auburn University and the University of Alabama Law School.

He served in the Alabama National Guard from 1969 to 1971.

In 1982, Bachus was elected to the Alabama Senate. In 1983, he was elected to the Alabama House of Representatives. In 1986,



he was elected to the Alabama State Board of Education. He became chairman of the Alabama Republican Party in 1991.

Prior to his political career, Bachus owned a sawmill and practiced law until 1992.

Bachus and his wife, Linda, have been recognized by multiple organizations for their support and contributions to medical research. They were awarded the National Distinguished Advocacy Award for Excellence in Cancer-Fighting Public Policy by The American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network.
