

### Blue Water Navy veterans win fight for VA benefits

"Mr. Procopio is entitled to a presumption of service connection for his prostate cancer and diabetes mellitus. Accordingly, we reverse."

- U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit Court

And with that statement, Blue Water Navy veterans won a major victory in their fight for VA benefits to treat illnesses linked to exposure to Agent Orange during the Vietnam War.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit ruled

Jan. 29 in favor of Alfred Procopio Jr., who served aboard the USS Intrepid during the war. Procopio, 73, suffers from diabetes and prostate cancer, both of which are linked to Agent Orange exposure.

American Legion National Commander Brett P. Reistad applauded the court's decision that found no reason to deny VA disability benefits for Procopio, who did not meet the "boots on the ground" criteria for Agent Orange-related VA

disability benefits.

"The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit echoes what The American Legion, multiple other veterans service organizations and Vietnam War veterans have been arguing since an administrative decision in 2002 cut off benefits to those who were exposed at sea," Reistad said. "It doesn't matter where you were exposed to Agent Orange when you served. It only matters that you were exposed when you served."

### Meet your shooting team: Maggie Vonderau


Maggie Vonderau began her shooting career when she was 14 years old, in the 8<sup>th</sup>

### Mint hosts first strike of American Legion commemorative coin

The first American Legion commemorative coins came off the press Jan. 31 during a ceremonial striking at the U.S. Mint in Philadelphia.

"As we reflect on our legacy of support to our nation's veterans, servicemembers and their families in patriotic communities everywhere, these coins are lasting and timeless expressions of the service and values The American Legion holds dear," National Commander Brett Reistad said.

"I am proud that all sur-



charges received from sales of American Legion commemorative coins will help us continue to fulfill our mission. Whether it is delivering hope in a time of need, advocating for veterans benefits, giving college scholarships to our nation's youth or provid-

ing much-needed assistance to veterans, servicemembers and their families, The American Legion will be there."

Set to go on sale March 14, coinciding with The American Legion's 100th birthday, the silver dollar pays tribute to the organization's Paris founding. The coin's heads side, or obverse, is designed by Paul Balan and features the American Legion emblem surrounded by oak leaves and a lily. The reverse side is designed by Patricia Lucas-Morris and has crossed U.S. and American Legion flags.

### Pre-game and Opening Ceremony Events Start Around 6:45 p.m.

Veterans, Active military personnel, and all who have honorably served will receive COMPLIMENTARY admission. Must present proof of service to include but not limited to Military ID, driver's license with military ID, ID tags, DD Form 214, VA medical card, or Veterans' organization membership card.

General admission is \$10 for adults, \$5 for children 12 and under, as well as University of Alabama students with Act Cards.

Pelham Fire Department will display a large American flag at the rink's entrance.

American Legion will have an event display tent with the flags of each military branch and a "Fallen Heroes' Table" in the rink's main lobby available for photos from 6-8 p.m.

Photos will be available for download on the Post 555 website at Al-post555.smugmug.com.

Post 555, known as the Triple Nickel, will also coordinate a display of variety of information tables displayed throughout the lobby and arena hallway as a small token of appreciation for our military members and Veterans such as a Veteran Service Officer information table regarding VA Compensations and Pension Benefits as well as American Village Veterans' Register of



Honor table.

Donated gift baskets for giveaways for Veterans and military members will also be available during the night.

Full Moon BBQ, Golden Rule BBQ, McAlister's Deli, and Texas Roadhouse in Pelham, Chubbfather's in Alabaster, DAR, and American Legion will donate gift bag items for Veterans and military members.

The Exchange Club of Shelby County will donate travel/miniature flags to the first 100 Active military and Veterans (with ID).

Opening/Pre-Game Ceremo-

ny:

Members from the Vincent High School JROTC will present the colors while members of the Pelham High School choir sing the National Anthem.

Also during the pre-game ceremonies, Pelham Mayor Gary Waters (an Army Veteran and member of the American Legion Post 555); and representing both military and Veterans, Harry Christian, Commander, Department of Alabama American Legion, a Panama Veteran, will join the team captains during the drop of the puck.

### Special Recognition and Ceremony at the End of the 1st Period:

At the end of the first period, the team and more than a dozen different local youth organizations will recognize all Service Members in attendance and present 100 gift bags provided by the Daughters of the American Revolutionary, along with a gift card for a meal provided by Texas Roadhouse in Pelham.

### New Sons PSAs highlight the Legion's centennial

Two new public service announcements (PSAs) from Sons of The American Legion National Commander Greg "Doc" Gibbs reflect this year's theme of "Honoring the Past ... Continuing the Legacy" while encouraging membership for those eligible for the Sons.

In one video, Gibbs touts the accomplishments of The American Legion, among them the GI Bill and relief efforts for disaster victims and children. "Help us pay



tribute to a century of service to the community, state, and nation, by joining the Sons of The American Legion today," Gibbs said.

Gibbs also references the importance of family in another new video, reflecting on his father's service in the U.S. Marine Corps in World War II.

"He came home to raise our family according to the values that he learned in the U.S. Marine Corps—semper fidelis, always faithful, always loyal. ... Together we stand for veterans, like my dad, and the values they fought for," Gibbs said.

Biggest Wreaths Across America ceremony ever at the Alabama National Cemetery (ALNC). All gravesites received wreaths. The crowd for this year's ceremony was over 3,000. Normally, people are told to arrive by 10:30 a.m. to be parked and in place for the short ceremony that precedes placing the wreaths. With such a large crowd arriving at the same time, Highway 119 was overwhelmed. Next year, we will advertise for folks planning to attend to arrive at 10 a.m. to help alleviate the congestion getting into the cemetery.

The ceremony itself was inspirational, the guest speaker, Medal of Honor recipient, U.S. Army Capt. Gary M. Rose, spoke movingly of the contributions of our Veterans and their families. The outpouring of support meant a lot to the families of those interred at ALNC. One mother said, "Wreaths Across America allows me to feel that I am still able to celebrate the holidays with my son buried at this shrine to our Veterans." In addition to the great support of Post 555 volunteers, this year the parking was conducted by about 50 people from various churches in the area and the Thompson High School Air Force JROTC; the CAP cadets raised funds and placed wreaths, Pelham High School athletic teams along with the University of Montevallo Lacrosse Team and Shelby County Sheriff's Department helped with setting up a thousand chairs for the ceremony. Under the leadership of Chairman Pam Nichols, the 150-member Support Committee for the Alabama National Cemetery planned, organized, produced a media plan and showed up to lead all the volunteers in picking up the wreaths three weeks later. 
