## A 50th-anniversary Legion keepsake

As the true 100th birthday of The American Legion draws closer, Emblem Sales has available for purchase a souvenir from a previous landmark anniversary: a limited quantity of original firstday issues of the American Legion 50th Anniversary stamp by the U.S. Postal Service. The 6-cent stamp is postmarked from - and was first placed on sale at – Washington, D.C., on March 15, 1969, the Legion's 50th anniversary.

According to the Postal Bulletin from Feb. 20, 1969, artist Robert Hallock of New-

ton, Conn., adapted a portion of the bald eagle on the Great Seal of the United States for the design. The eagle clutches an olive branch, the heraldic symbol of peace. The stamp was lithographed and

engraved using a Giori press. Inside the envelope that contains the stamp is a postcard describing The American Legion in 1969.

The collection was made available to Emblem Sales by the library at American



Legion National Headquarters in Indianapolis. The stamps are \$2 each. You can purchase them at https://emblem.legion.org/First-Day-Cover-50th-Anniversary-S t a m p - 1 9 6 9 / productinfo/735.950.



## lagging last year by 33 percent!



In 1920, during The American Legion National Convention in Cleveland, the organization went on record urging all American Legion men to become qualified voters. Since then, the organization has passed countless similar resolutions advocating Legionnaires to not only exercise their constitutional responsibility to vote, but to also encourage others to do the same.

## NATIONAL CEMETERY HAPPENINGS

Alabama National Cemetery

The Alabama National Cemetery is well postured for mission success going into Fall and Winter. Fiscal year 2018 closed out with the purchase of several pieces of much needed equipment. The cemetery added a new handicap accessible golf cart and a standard golf cart to the fleet which is so important for transporting mobility challenged. Also received funding for three new utility vehicles, a stump grinder and new casket lowering devices.

The facilities are also in great shape. The recent expansion project added 5,000 preplaced crypt sites for caskets and 1,500 new in-ground cremation sites. Recent upgrades include new tile in administration office, irrigation system got a new sustainment pump and shelter two was re-stained. Staffing is now at 100 percent with the hiring of a new Caretaker, Mr. Gray Foster. Additionally, Mr. Herman Watkins was promoted to Administrative Officer.

In the last fiscal year, Alabama National Cemetery took care of 984 Veterans and eligible family members. That number is up from 905 last year and 750 from two years ago. In the last quarter, Alabama National Cemetery burials included Veterans who had served



one tour, Veterans who were retired from all branches, a pioneering female WWII sailor, and an indigent Veteran. Each burial received dignity, honor and respect. A large part of that comes form the support this community gives our Veterans. Support Committee ALNC, Patriot Guard Riders, American Legion Riders and great Veteran Service organizations like American Legion Post 555 all contribute to the success of Alabama National Cemetery.

Some of the exciting opportunities coming up for our membership include:

- 7 Nov 2018 10:00 AM Gravesite flags will be placed at each site in the National Cemetery for Veteran's Day. AL Post 555 has adopted one of the burial sections to place the flags. Also, volunteers can help the Support Committee set up the Avenue of Flags.
- 13 Nov 2018 10:00 AM Need volunteers to remove gravesite flags and Avenue of Flags.
- 15 Dec 2018 11:00 AM Wreaths Across America Ceremony open to public.
- 17 Dec 2018 9:00 AM Volunteers needed to take down Avenue of Flags.
- 12 Jan 2019 10:00 AM Volunteers needed to take up wreaths

## Construction of National Army Museum moving along

The National Museum of the United States Army is quickly taking shape on 84 acres of land at Fort Belvoir, Va., less than 30 minutes south of Washington, D.C. The museum will honor and celebrate the service and sacrifice of the more than 30 million men and women who have worn the Army uniform since 1775. It is scheduled to

open in 2020.

The American Legion has supported the building of the National Museum of the United States Army since 2005, through the adoption of Resolution No. 17.

Construction of the \$200million privately and publicly funded museum broke ground about two years ago, with the main building consisting of 185,000 square feet that will display Army artifacts, documents, images and artwork. According to a recent press release, the majority of these items have never been seen by the public.
