

After a month there, Marion was made commanding officer of the WAC Detachment which was a captain's slot. She made first lieutenant in July,

but even so, was bumped in February by a captain who returned from service in China/Burma/India and wanted an assignment in her home state of Georgia. Marion went back to Fort McClellan, where she set-up the Field Training Unit for the basic training program. She was discharged in April 1957.

Marion said she served

for three years and loved every minute. She had great assignments, great opportunities, and responsible positions. She stated that she was always very busy, and very proud of her service to her country and all that she was able to do. Marion's last remark was that she made lifetime friends, and has fantastic memories.

I would like to share some updated information I recently received regarding the awarding of the Korean War Ambassador of Peace Medal. I presented this information several months ago, but one of our members, Marion Kane, shared a copy of a flier she received regarding the awarding of this medal in Montgomery on Nov. 16. I was so surprised (because the initial information I received said the awarding of this medal would be after the beginning of the New Year), that I contacted the individual listed on the flier. She told me that the reason for having the award ceremony so soon was that some of the Korean War Veterans were literally at death's door, and they and their family members needed to have the medals awarded quickly, which they did.

The Ambassador of Peace Medal can still be requested by using the following criteria. You must provide a copy of your DD Form 214 which documents your service on the land in Korea, in the air over Korea, or on the sea around Korea during the period of June 25, 1950 through July 27, 1953, or if you were on a UN Peacekeeping Mission through the end of 1955. You need to mail the DD Form 214 along with your full name and current mailing address to the following address.

Let me be among the first to wish each of you and your families a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

The 2018 campaign to raise donations for Wreaths Across America was a big success thanks to all who contributed. In 2017, the consolidated Post contribution was \$1,335. In 2018, we raised a total of \$1,660 or an increase over the prior year of over 24 percent.

Wreaths Across America – The WAA ceremony will take place at the Alabama National Cemetery in Montevallo on Saturday, Dec. 15th at 11 a.m. Sometime that week the wreaths will be delivered to the cemetery and volunteers will be needed to unload the truck and

reload them onto trailers in preparation for the ceremony. As in the past, we don't know exactly when the truck will arrive at the cemetery. We will receive notice approximately 24 hours in advance. We would appreciate any help you might be able to provide.

Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing - Earlier this week I became aware of an outreach project dedicated to the physical and emotional rehabilitation of disabled active and retired military personnel. Much like Operation Therapic, which utilizes photography as a rehabilitation medium through Eric Fort, Project Healing Waters utilizes fly fishing as the medium. I have attached some information about this program as well as a contact person's information for anyone who might be interested.

Nominating Committee and Officer Candidates – The Officer nomination and candidate selection cycle is upon us beginning in January. I will be looking for three non-Officer Post members in good standing to serve on the Nominating Committee. This committee will be selected in January and will meet to make their nominations in February with nominations announced in March. 

NATIONAL CEMETERY HAPPENINGS

Alabama National Cemetery

For the first time ever, the gravesite flags were on display for Veterans Day. In the past, the gravesite flags were only used for Memorial Day. Thanks for all the help from AL Post 555.

A new in-ground section (Section 6) for cremations is now in use and has 35 burials. As a reminder, the Floral Policy follows:

The cemetery welcomes and encourages fresh-cut flowers throughout the year. Floral containers are located throughout the cemetery for public use and free of charge. Items left at grave side must be floral in nature and may not stand taller than the headstone.

Floral items and other decorations may not be secured to the headstone. Flowers will be removed when spent, for mowing and maintenance, or if damaged by weather or wildlife.

No permanent floral vases are permitted. Due to the open nature of the grounds, we cannot guarantee against theft, vandalism or the effects of nature. Artificial flowers will be permitted during the period from Oct. 1 through April 1.

Plantings will not be permitted on graves at any time. Potted plants will be permitted on graves during the period 10 days before and 10 days after Easter Sunday, Memorial Day, Veterans Day and Christmas.

Christmas wreaths or grave blankets

are permitted on graves from Dec. 15 through Jan. 10 and will be removed not later than Jan. 20 of each year. Grave floral blankets may not be larger than 2 by 3 feet.

Upcoming events include:

Dec. 15 – 11 a.m. — Wreaths Across America Ceremony begins at 11 a.m. and is open to public. We expect a crowd of approximately 2,000 this year. Recommend arriving at cemetery by 10:30am. Following the short ceremony, family members of those buried at ALNC will place wreaths on their loved one's gravesite. After this time, volunteers will place wreaths on the remaining gravesites. This is a very patriotic event and a time to honor our veterans.

Dec. 17 – 9 a.m. — Volunteers needed to take down Avenue of Flags.

Jan. 12 - 10 a.m. — Volunteers needed to take up wreaths


